WE HAVE FIVE MAIN FOCUSES IN 2022 - 23:

1. Energy conservation

To promote energy conservation, students conducted an energy saving competition by installing electro-meter in classrooms, as a way to demonstrate a simple change in behavior and habits to consume less energy in our daily activities.

2. Waste management (4R Strategies)

To raise awareness of waste separation, prevention and promote reuse ideas, students conducted an activity about waste separation and turn waste into useful products (orange cleanser)



3. Greening

To learn to share and keep everything in balance for showing how an ecosystem works, students conducted a terrarium workshop in order to demonstrate how life on our planet sustains itself. We would like to send an important message to everyone – all living things have the same resources, we have to promote sustainability, which beneficial to all life on earth.

4. Peace and ethnic friendly campus

To foster inclusion and awareness among different cultures, we joined "Racially Friendly Campus Recognition Scheme" organized by Equal Opportunities Commission this year, we conducted some cultural workshops, like Golden Tea Latte, Henna Drawing and Kahoot Quiz. Through different activities, we would like to create multicultural awareness and inclusion, in order to encourage acceptance and help students to prepare themselves to thrive in the future.





5. Plastic-free campus

To encourage SPC community to work together to go 'plastic-free' and build a sustainable green campus by reducing the use of plastic disposables, we are going to join the 'Plastic-free Campus' campaign during May to July in 2023, organized by Environment and Ecology Bureau.

SOLAR HARVEST

70 panels were installed on the rooftop of the new classroom block and fully funded by the "Solar Harvest" scheme, a Government programme promoting the development of local renewable energy.

The College also joined the Feed-in Tariff (FiTT) Scheme to generate 18,000kWh of electricity a year.

Green wall and Herb Farm

Green wall and herb farm, described as vertical gardens that encompass plants, a growing mechanism and a watering system, provide teachers with a new way to integrate STEAM principles into the curriculum. The benefits of green wall and herb farm don't end at increased learning opportunities. The most important component of vertical garden is the change plant life has on the mind and body. Because stress levels often run high in schools, greenery at campus that decrease carbon dioxide in the campus naturally act as a catalyst to reduce stress and anxiety.

• Plastic Free Campus

Promote Plastic-free Campus, no disposable plastic straws and BYOU (Bring Your Own Utensils)

Mobile phone chargers powered by fitness bikes

SPC SDG ambassadors are going to fill three stationary bikes that power gadgets and a Wi-Fi connection as you pedal. It takes about 30 minutes of easy pedalling to charge an iPhone, the same amount of time it would take while plugged into the wall.

Carbon audit (on top of the one offered by UNESCO)

Conducting carbon audit is a common first step of action. It helps assess the carbon performance and identify room for emission reduction in an organisation. It is a cornerstone for saving energy as well as taking forward other low carbon and green measures.
